### 1. Dongsam Innovative Zone Campus

Form "Ocean Cluster" with Ministry of Oceans and Fisheries governmental agencies Create synergy effect through integration of ocean industry R&D and networking

### 2. Jinhae Military University Campus

Korea's first ever contract department that is established in Jinhae Chief of Naval Education and Training in the form of a college. It strengthens specialized technical skills with the aim to improve expert knowledge and combat capabilities of active duty service men and women and civilian employees

### 3. Choryang DownTown Campus

Certified period from March 2015 to February 2018

### Overseas dispatch training for global ocean leaders and business units

Provide opportunities to study leading technologies such as supporting on-site tours and visits to foreign companies and internships Improve foreign language skills and global-based minds under the guidance of foreigner professors
